(3) How can your professional skills contribute to society? Include your name on the essay.

Attach a letter of recommendation from your Teacher, Guidance Counselor, JROTC Leader, Principal or SAME member.

- **CERTIFICATION**

Attach the Guidance Counselor or Principal certification information.
