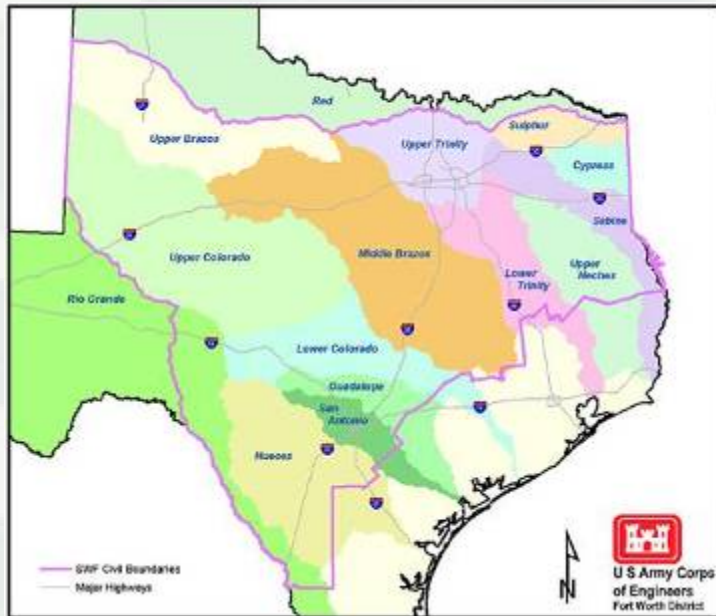


Fort Worth District Boundaries

Civil Works

- FY09 Workload: \$218M
- Flood protection
 - ▶ 25 reservoirs, levees, and floodways
- Power
 - ▶ 3 hydropower plants
- Drinking Water
 - ▶ 35% of supply
- Recreation
 - ▶ 314 public parks
